HOW TO LAUNCH A MOCK BUSINESS CLASS

A survey of 500 adult entrepreneurs found that 13 percent started their first business at the age of eighteen or younger. "Fear of Failure" is a prime concern of 67 percent of teens, who say it might stop them from starting a business. (Alaska Business)

In this class students ages 13-19 years old will learn:

- How to choose a business name.
- How to define their businesses brand.
- How to design a mood board, brand kit, logo, business cards, basic website and a business presentation.

Students will learn valuable skills such as:

- Graphic Design
- Web Design
- Branding
- Color
- Typography
- Marketing

FREE *in-person or virtual tutoring* for students in 1st-12th grade by trained professionals.

One out of every five citizens in our community is below the poverty level with a graduation rate for high school seniors of 77%. A serious crime is committed in our city every eight hours. These statistics suggest an economic nightmare, crime-ridden, education deficient neighborhood.

BLACK MASCULINE MENTAL HEALTH CLASSES

Expectations surrounding Black masculinity, such as the requirement to be strong, have often prevented Black men from seeking mental health care. It's no secret that exposure to racism and discrimination is linked to various adverse mental health outcomes. As mental health challenges continue to rise in this community, some Black Americans still aren't receiving the mental health care and treatment they may need.

In this class you will learn to understand the social construction of race and gender, identify social and environmental factors which may negatively impact Black men, increase awareness of your own culture, gain knowledge of the history of systematic oppression of Black men, and discuss strategies for providing empowerment.

FINANCIAL EMPOWERMENT CLASS

Being financially literate is crucial to establish a strong foundation for handling money.

Young adults who receive financial education are less likely to carry credit card debt, and more likely to apply to and receive grants and financial aid. - Council for Economic Education

Less than 17% of students were required to take at least one semester of personal finance in high school. -Council for Economic Education

About 55% of adults are financially literate in the United States, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, and the United Kingdom. -Standard & Poor

One in four parents reported that they never or almost never talk to their kids about household finances. -Guidant

In our course, students learn the foundations of money management, budgeting, saving, investing, debt and more.
